Advising Notes

Major Advisors

- All students have a faculty advisor for their majors. Contact the department office for the name and contact information for your advisor. Advisors schedule and post regular office hours. If these hours are inconvenient, please call or email your advisor to make an appointment. **We recommend that you meet with your advisor every semester.**
- Students may make adjustments in their programs to fulfill specific needs and career objectives **in consultation with and approval by** their advisors.

Grading

- Credit/No Credit grading is not permitted for courses in the major unless CR/NC is specified for a particular course.
- A grade of *C* or better is required in all major courses.

General Education

- General Education courses **may not** be double counted to simultaneously satisfy Major and General Education requirements.
- The General Education requirement of 51 units (39 lower division and 12 upper division) may be exceeded depending upon the selection of courses. Such excess units are counted under Other Electives toward the 120 unit degree.

Graduation Requirements

- Students must complete a minimum of 40 upper division units for the Baccalaureate Degree.
- In order to graduate, students must achieve a cumulative average of **C or better**.
- Students who anticipate graduating by the end of a term must file an application for graduation and pay required fees to the Evaluations Office **within the first two weeks** of that term.
- Students who wish to participate in the College of Agricultural Sciences and Technology Convocation must **notify the department** administrative assistant during spring semester.
